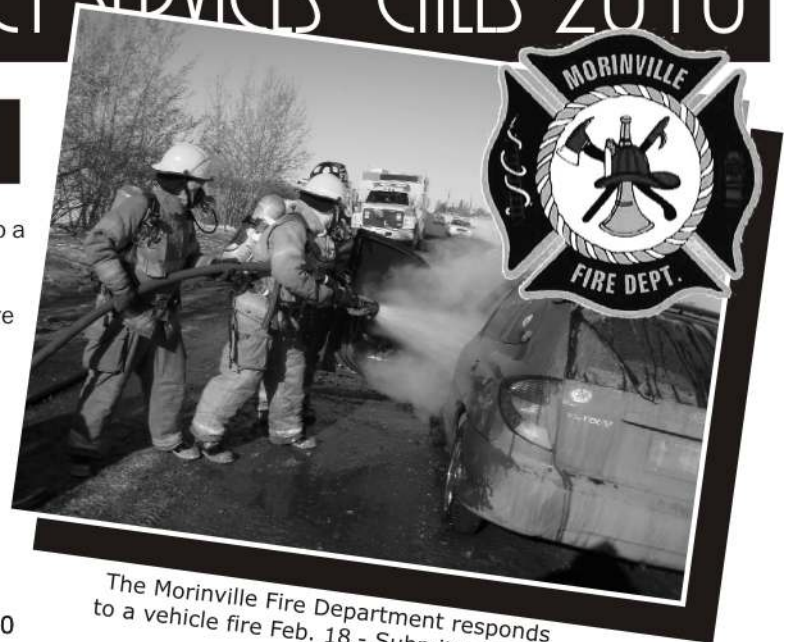


FIRE DEPARTMENT CALLS 2010*

As of Dec. 20, the Morinville Fire Department had responded to a total of 324 calls in 2010.

The following is a breakdown of the types of calls the fire department responded to:

MORINVILLE RCMP CALLS 2010*

As of Dec. 22, the Morinville RCMP had responded to 14,287 calls for service, 5,019 of which were in Morinville. In 2009 the Morinville Detachment responded to 14,682 calls, of which 5,335 were in Morinville. Staff Sergeant Mac Richards said he anticipates 2010 will conclude with a similar number of calls to 2009.

SEPT. - OCT. 2010

After a 2007 electoral cycle that saw Morinville's mayor and council acclaimed, Morinville voters were given plenty of choice in 2010. When nominations closed sept. 20 there were two candidates for mayor and 10 for council.

Then Councillor Joseph Trapani made a move to take on incumbent Mayor Lloyd Bertschi, while newcomers Nicole Boutestein, Lisa Holmes, Kerry Knight, Jackie Luker-Chevalier, David Pattison and Lucie Roy sought to take on incumbent councillors Gordon Boddez, Paul Krauskopf, Donna Phinney and Ben Van De Walle. Councillor Joe Gosselin did not seek re-election.

When the dust of the election had settled, Bertschi defeated Trapani and veteran Councillors Gordon Boddez, Paul Krauskopf and Ben Van De Walle were joined by newcomers Nicole Boutestein, Lisa Holmes and David Pattison.

Halloween hockey

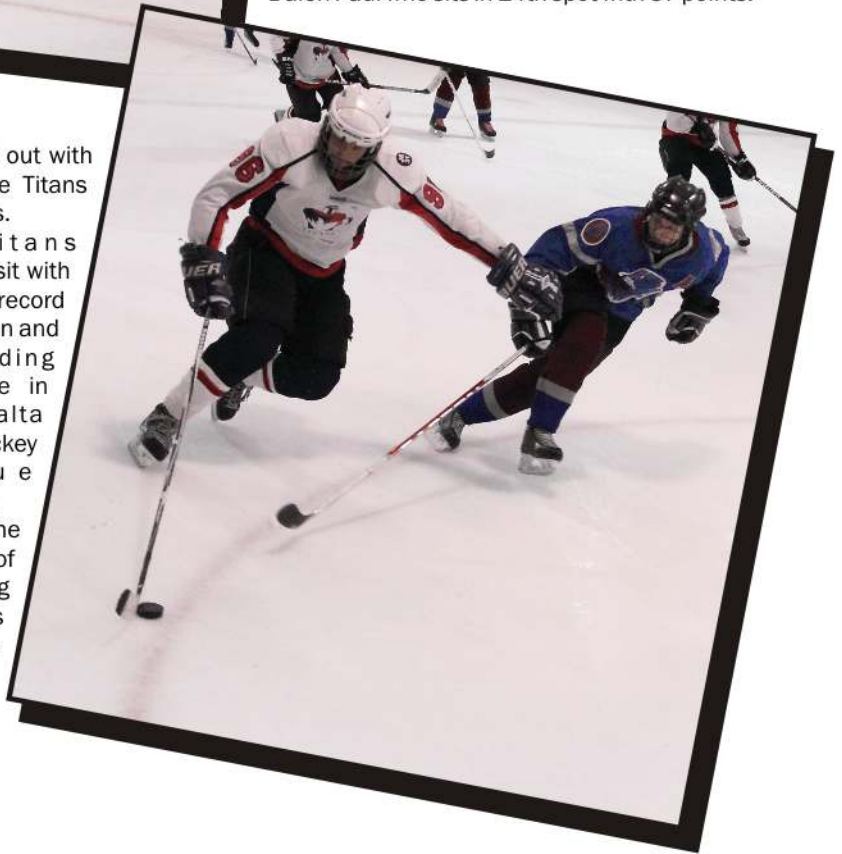
